INTERNATIONAL STUDENT RECEIVES REDUCED OUTCOME AT COURT

In 2022, M* arrived in Australia to study. In early 2024, M was stopped by Victoria Police on a major road for riding a motorbike with a broken light. The police officer asked M for their licence and M showed the police officer their overseas motorcycle licence. Police questioned M about why they had not applied for a Victorian licence and M replied they didn't think they needed to do this. Some weeks later, paperwork arrived in the mail addressed to M and they realised they had been charged with riding a motorcycle without a valid Victorian licence.

M quickly made an appointment with the Deakin Student Legal Service and spoke with a lawyer who provided them with advice and explained their legal options. The Deakin Student Legal Service held a Summary Case Conference with Victoria Police and asked the police to consider a Diversion Order in this case.

Written submissions were prepared by the Deakin Student Legal Service for M to take to their court hearing. After reviewing the submissions, M was given a reduced fine without conviction by the court.
